Continues to serve as the state's Federal Liaison with the US Department of Education and also serves as a senior advisor to staff in the Division of Accountability Services regarding the state's ABCs Accountability Program, the statewide testing program, and the state's accountability and assessment plans for the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). Also a member of the state's Race to the Top Leadership Team.

◆ **Director of Accountability Policy & Communications, Division of Accountability Services** (October, 2008 – August, 2011). This position also involves monthly presentations to the North Carolina State Board of Education, numerous presentations and public speaking engagements at the state and national level, presentations for school district personnel, state legislative committees and interviews with members of the media.
